

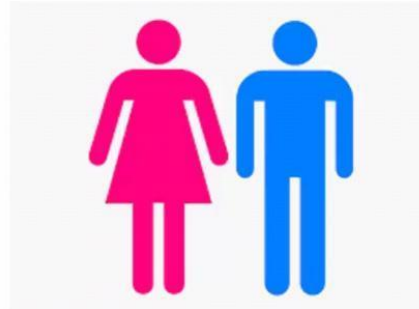

#DigitalLiteracyManifesto

Digital literacy (aka information literacy or media literacy) is an essential competency for everyone in the 21st century. Canadians have always valued truth, transparency, knowledge, collaboration and communication. Education and awareness campaigns are helping Canadians learn to be critical and well-informed consumers of information. But information publishers can also play a crucial role by promoting digital citizenship and facilitating information and media literacy. We believe that communications professionals in industries, government, nonprofit and the media can help set higher standards for digital literacy in Canada and worldwide by adopting the following five imperatives.

Help us commemorate this call to action between Social Media Day (#SMDay, June 30, 2020) and Media Literacy Week (October 26-30, 2020) by tweeting out these imperatives and also adding new imperatives whenever gaps may exist:

- 1 Give Technology a Human Voice**

- 5 Authenticate & Orientate**
Include human-readable, verifiable content in all digital information including authors, date published, date modified, geolocation (if related), intended audiences and sources.
