1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

During the Year 2016-17, changes were made in the syllabi of BSc, BCom, BA, BMS & B.Com (B & I) by University of Mumbai. Question paper pattern changed to hundred marks (100) in each semester for BA, BSc and B. Com courses. The details of the revision in the syllabi is as follows:

- **Arts**

There was change in syllabus of **first year** for the following subjects:

Economics: The syllabus has become more concept based.

Sociology- The syllabus was changed to blend traditional and contemporary concepts in Sociology. New topics like Tourism, Environment, Social Media were introduced.

Marathi- No significant change was made

English- New authors have been introduced in the poem, short stories, novel and drama sections.

Political Science- The syllabus was modified to introduce the students to the Indian Political system both the constitutional framework as well as the processes that influence the system.

History- No substantial change.

Foundation course – No major change

- **Science**

There was change in syllabus of first year of the following subjects:

Physics- The syllabus was upgraded by introducing some of the Second Year and Third Year topics at the First Year.

Chemistry- The syllabus was modified to align with UGC syllabus pattern

Botany- The syllabus was upgraded to make it more industry oriented.

Foundation course – No major change

There was change in syllabus of **second year** Physics- minor changes by shuffling of units and a unit on Cosmology was added.

There was change in syllabus of **third year** Mathematics- The elective basic concepts of Probability and Random Variables was opted to give students broader knowledge to choose their career/progress for higher studies in inter disciplinary areas such as Financial Mathematics/ Actuarial sciences etc.

- **Commerce**

There was change in syllabus of **first year** Economics, Accounts, Foundation course and EVS.

Economics: Concepts related to recent developments were introduced.

Accountancy- Accounting related to insurance claim was introduced.

Foundation course- No major change in syllabus.

Environment Studies- The syllabus was modified to delete geography related topics and environment related topics were added.

- **BMS**

College introduced “Human Resource Group” as elective for Second year

- **B.Com (B& I)**

The subject of Foundation Course was introduced to bring uniformity across streams. The University also introduced electives like Organisational Behaviour and Information Technology for First Year students and Financial Accountancy subject as well. The objective was to provide a basic understanding of Financial Accounting right at the first year level. Projects have been introduced in the subject of Foundation Course for sem 1 and sem2.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection

- The college has a well maintained garden with large number of trees and floral plants. There is a separate section in the garden for medicinal plants.
- The college has collaborated with an NGO, StreeMuktiSanghatana and installed an organic waste management system on campus to take care of the waste generated by the college canteen and garden. The project is partially funded by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and Ministry of Environment and Forests (MOEF).
- The college has a tie up with the NGO ParisarBhaginiVikas Sangha for collecting the e-waste from the college for recycling. The facility is also extended to staff and students thus sensitizing them towards e-waste management.
- Tube lights are being replaced by energy saving LED bulbs in a phased manner. LED lights have been already fixed in the corridor and classrooms of basement. About 50 tube lights have already been replaced with LED lights.
- Student volunteers are designated as Energy Auditors to monitor wastage of electricity in the college campus and to spread awareness about the responsibilities towards conservation of energy and also reducing carbon footprints.
- NSS volunteers participated in tree plantation project along with an NGO "HARIYALI".
- The month of July is earmarked each year with 'Save Environment' as the theme for monthly drive. Students take up activities like tree plantation, poster displays with slogans dealing with environmental issues.
- Botany Department participates in Van Mahostav celebration by MCGM (Municipal Cooperation Greater Mumbai)
- Towards promoting lesser use of plastic, students are encouraged to use eco friendly rakhis and colours during Rakshabandhan and Holi festivals

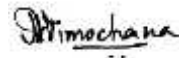
